Whether painting a self-congratulatory Duke of Wellington, a gentle Queen Maria Luisa, or a guarded Marchesa, Goya saw through his sitters' carefully arranged public façades. Fifty portraits, each a penetrating characterisation in line and paint, are thematically and chronologically presented in this exhibition; we witness the steady emergence of an ever more powerful and perceptive artist.

This exhibition, as its curator suggests, 'will blow you away'.
