

THE YEAR IN QUESTION 1947

WEDNESDAY 30 SEPTEMBER

India and Pakistan gain independence, Hungary is taken over by Communist politicians; anti-Communist Senator Joseph McCarthy begins chairing the House Un-American Activities Committee, the National Security Act is passed, and the CIA established by President Truman; Secretary of State George Marshall proposes massive financial aid to Europe; Trieste is declared a Free City State by the UN; the Kon-Tiki makes safe landing in the Polynesian islands, while the ship Exodus, filled with holocaust survivors is denied port in Palestine; first zoom lens and first polaroid camera tested, and the word 'computer' is first used; the heroic modernist work of Mies van der Rohe and Marcel Breuer brings simplicity and order to architecture; William Dawson, John Lee, Percival Prattis and Jackie Robinson break colour lines and Billie Holiday is arrested in her apartment for possession of drugs; Arthur Miller's All My Sons and Tennessee Williams' Streetcar Named Desire premiere; Jackson Pollock's first paintings drip; 'New Look' fashion turns housewives on their ears; Philip Larkin's A Girl in Winter and WH Auden's Age of Anxiety, Evelyn Waugh's The Loved One and Malcolm Lowry's masterpiece Under the Volcano published; Stravinsky's Petrushka, Duruflé's Requiem, and William Walton's String Quartet in A Minor performed; the voices of Frankie Laine, Frank Sinatra and the Andrews Sisters croon; the musicals Oklahoma and Brigadoon delight.
