

THE CATHEDRAL OF ST DAVIDS

Monday 27 APRIL - Thursday 30 APRIL 2020

Home and burial place of the beloved patron saint of Wales; intentionally hidden in a hollow and behind high walls to evade detection; beautifully set on the far western tip of picturesque Pembrokeshire; primary Anglo-Saxon and medieval centre of Christianity and literature, source of the of the 'Annales Cambriae' and the revitalisation of the cultural and intellectual life of King Alfred's Kingdom of Wessex; one of the most important pilgrimage sites in western civilisation after William the Conqueror prayed there and a magnificent new Cathedral built; mighty Bishops palace built by Bishop Gower 14c; St Mary's Chantry built by John of Gaunt; fan-vaulted ceiling of Trinity Chapel inspired that of Kings College Chapel in Cambridge; birthplace of the great Welsh leader, Rhys ap Gryffudd, the Welsh historian Gerald of Wales, and Edmund Tudor, father of Henry VII and founder of the Tudor dynasty; private visit to nearby medieval Picton Castle; visits to medieval Pembroke, Monkton Priory the oldest domestic building in Wales, and the retreat of the Bishops of St Davids at the Palace of Lamphey; optional boat trip out to see puffins, manx shearwaters and seals of Skomer island.



Twr y Felin

St David's, Pembrokeshire SA62 6QT (01437 725555; twryfelinhotel.com)

Built in 1806 as a working windmill, Twr y Felin is Wales' first contemporary art hotel, located in Britain's smallest city, St Davids. Meticulously restored and extended, featuring contemporary design throughout which contrasts beautifully with the unique characteristics of the historic building, the hotel is now home to 21 ensuite bedrooms, including two unique suites – the feature room 'Tyddewi' – a distinctive space occupying the site's original windmill tower, which boasts spectacular 360 degree views of the St Davids Peninsula from its own observatory. As an art hotel, Twr y Felin features the works of 20 Welsh, British and International artists, with over 100 pieces of specially commissioned art, inspired by the St Davids peninsula and Pembrokeshire, on display throughout the hotel. Set in its own private grounds, just a few hundred metres from the centre of St Davids and the 6th century St Davids Cathedral, Twr y Felin is perfectly situated for our Inscape Retreat.

Twr y Felin Hotel's two Rosette Restaurant Blas – meaning 'Taste' in Welsh – offers a menu influenced directly by the season with dishes designed to accent Wales' culinary traditions. Caught between the sea Pembrokeshire Wales.
